

Hampden County Re-Entry Partnership



Since the partnership's inception in 2003 through June 30, 2020, over 20,000 distinct individuals have been served.

Each year the program has provided over 26,000 services to over 2,700 individuals.¹

62% of Re-Entry customers served Behind The Wall sought out HCRP services after their release.

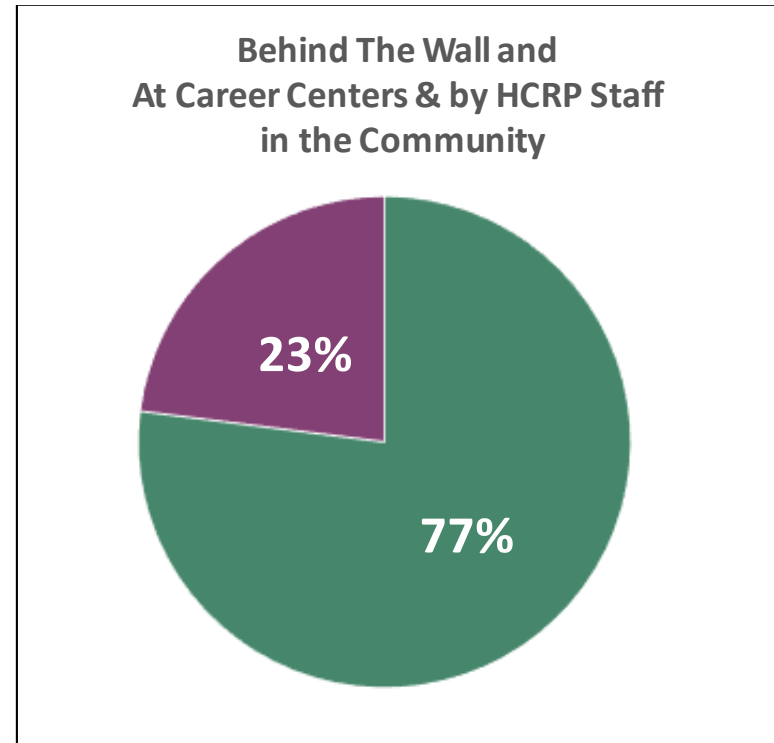
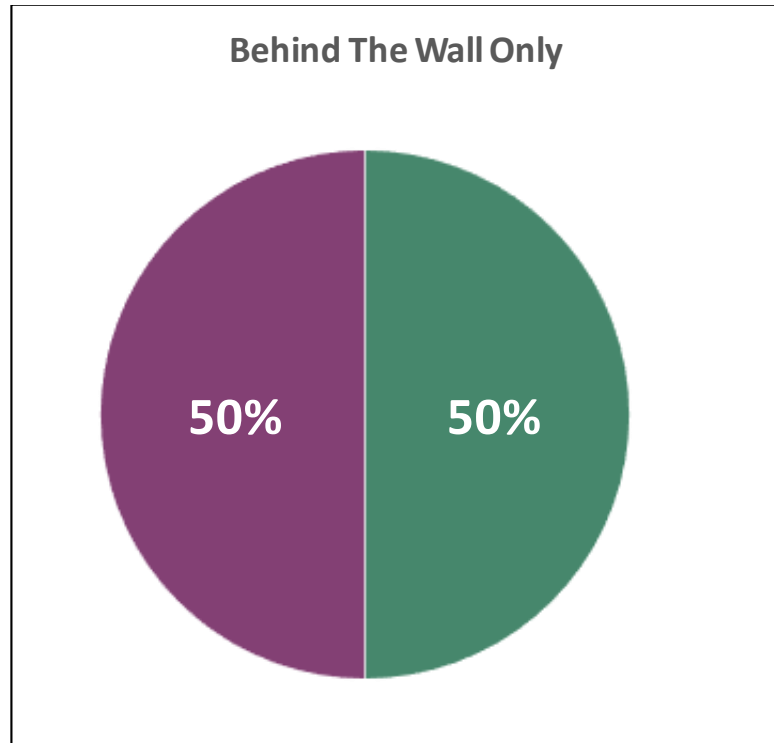
Outcomes Based on Where Re-Entry Customers Obtained Services ²

Highlights:

- 62% of the Re-Entry customers who were served Behind The Wall sought out re-entry services after their release.
- Of those who received services after release, 60% were served, both by the HCRP Grant Staff in the community and at the Career Centers and 40% utilized only Career Center services.
- Those Re-entry customers who received re-entry services after release had a 75% placement rate, one and a half times the placement rate for those who never sought re-entry services after release.
- Those Re-Entry customers who received re-entry services in the community and at the Career Centers after release had a placement rate of 77%.
- The retention rate of those re-entry customers still employed in the third quarter after last service was 16 percent higher for those Re-entry customers who sought re-entry services in the community and/or at the Career Centers (76%) in comparison to those who only received re-entry services Behind The Wall (60%).
- The Career Centers also served 8516 Ex-Offenders who self-connected with the centers and were not affiliated with Hampden County Sheriffs Department programs.
- Of these Non-Affiliated Ex-Offenders, 5487 (64%) obtained employment and 67% were still employed in the 3rd Quarter after their last service.
